Trustees have met quarterly, to oversee and progress Euston Foodbank business and remained in email and internet contact. We have in 2024 a grant from the Trussell Trust which will mean two further 0.5 posts will be appointed for 2025.

There have been improvements greening the front quadrangle, with plants from St James's Piccadilly Royal Chelsea Flower Show particularly a willow and a wisteria. Grants from Mace constructors and High Speed Two Meanwhile money from the treasury have paid for bespoke outdoor furniture from recycled pallet wood made by Wood of Recycled Delight.

Euston Foodbank (EFB) supports a rolling number of over 400 households a week and still distributes the majority of food parcels in the borough of Camden. It is the third largest in the Trussell Trust. 60,000 parcels were distributed 2023/2024.

The main reason people attend foodbanks is low income, 56%, with benefit changes and delays the next most common reason at 20%. There has been some movement from single homeless 15% to more children in bigger families from estates and refugee hotels. Half our clients are still homeless people.

We have around 40 volunteers for our 4 weekly sessions and have held training recruitment events to keep their numbers up. Heartfelt thanks go to them, our donors – both food and funds - and our volunteer drivers, and trustees. We could not function without you all.

The impending energy and cost of living crisis on top of poverty from the austerity economy measures in the context of the climate and ecological disaster continue to increase the need for foodbank support in our community. So although we would like to see the need for foodbanks phased out, we do not think this will be soon.

Although demand has continued to increase due to austerity, cost of living and the energy crisis and life is even grimmer for millions in our country, we have been able to step up in what continues to be a hostile environment. Just this last month anti-social behaviour rocketed in a longitudinal park created by cutting off Phoenix Road, and the other week overnight, double yellow lines were painted around every street outside the foodbank making deliveries challenging, not only for us but also Food for All UK on our premises.

Euston Foodbank is still providing the majority of emergency parcels in Camden, as reported in the Trussell Trust statistics. We are one of many emergency food initiatives relied upon by the government, but we still hope foodbanks will become unnecessary. There has been a 44% increase in people seeking support from Euston Foodbank since the previous year.

Incoming stock 2023/2024

Although food distribution was greater than incoming stock, we had a modest cushion of donated stock to cover the shortfall. However, this highlights that it is increasingly hard to get donations of stock and the money to buy supplies.

Our biggest support is Foodbank Aid who donated over a third of our incoming stock. If we use the Trussell Trust multiplier of £2.37 per kilo, their donation in kind is £257,647, and it is hard to imagine how we would manage without them.

Households supported by Euston Foodbank by Camden Wards

The continuing increase is clear over the years, and for this year for the Borough of Camden is 31%. If we take just **the constituency of Holborn and St Pancras** (so NOT the wards in the west and north: Belsize, Fortune Green, Frognal, Gospel Oak, Hampstead Town, Highgate, South Hampstead, Swiss Cottage and West Hampstead) the increase since the previous year is 94%, from 12,901 in 2022/23 to 25,085 in 2023/24.
